

News About the Findley Lake Region Tapestry

It's No Secret Community Connections "Makes Life Easier"

The community was waiting in anticipation for a secret to be revealed on Thursday, July 18 and when Dr. Lin Baylis, Executive Director of Community Connections at Findley Lake (CC@FL) disclosed the exciting news, the audience burst into applause. "Aging in Place" is the buzz phrase that is used to describe people who are able to stay in their homes as

they grow older. A community that has a large percentage of older adults who are aging in place is a naturally occurring retirement community (NORC). Greg Olsen, Director of the New York State Office for Aging, was the keynote speaker at the gazebo in Findley Lake and shared, on behalf of Governor Andrew Cuomo, that a NORC grant of almost \$500,000 was awarded to CC@FL because of the organization's history of successful community outreach services. The grant award of \$99,999 per year for five years will be used by CC@FL to expand and enhance services to local seniors. Lin declared that being awarded the NORC grant is an incredible honor for our small town as only two rural communities in New York State have been officially designated as a grant funded NORC. Chautauqua County Executive George Borrello congratulated the board of directors of Community Connections for their efforts to assist area seniors and for working collaboratively with the County Office for Aging and the Sheriff's Department. Rebecca Brumagin, Town of Mina Supervisor, spoke about the town's diverse needs, that older adults can be constrained or enabled by the culture of the community, and that aging in place helps to preserve autonomy and dignity. The grant went into effect on July 1, 2019 and an advisory council will be established. The tag line for Community Connections is "Making Life Easier" – in its 6½ years of providing services it has done just that.

The 70th annual Findley Lake Watershed Foundation meeting was held at Camp Findley on Sat., July 20. Board members spoke about the following

topics: 1) Marci Schwab, chair of communication committee, about the new website

(findleylakewf.org); Lex Brumagin, chair of membership committee, thanked members for their support with contributions up 20%, and; Phil Persons.

treasurer, provided information on funding for the new weed harvester. Ed Mulkearn, president, thanked Marty Proctor for his 18 years of service as a board member. Bill Boria, County Water Specialist, shared myths about septic systems in Findley Lake and also that a Health Dept. letter is being sent to property owners on the mandatory inspection program for septic systems. Dave McCoy, County Watershed Coordinator, spoke about the County's Sewer Agency (see related article). Alex Lictus presented information on the NYS CSLAP (Citizens Statewide Lake Assessment Program) that is a volunteer lake monitoring program managed by NYS Dept. of Environmental Conservation and the NYS Federation of Lake Associations (FOLA). Samples in Findley Lake are taken regularly and are reported on the FLWF & DEC websites. Karl Kimmich discussed aeration systems that use solar power in ponds and lakes to bring dead water to the surface to oxygenate it. It is not an alternative to a sewer system but it does improve lake quality.

County Sewer Agency Formed

At the annual Findley Lake Watershed Foundation meeting, Dave McCoy, County

Watershed Coordinator, (at right) spoke briefly about the Chautauqua County Sewer Agency that is assessing options in regard to the possible formation of a sewer district that includes Findley Lake. The county



legislature approved the shared services effort and a funding proposal to engage a firm to conduct an engineering feasibility study. The study will look at three options: 1) A Town of French Creek (Peek'n Peak) and Findley Lake Sewer District with treatment provided by Village of Sherman; 2) A Town of French Creek (PNP) and Findley Lake Sewer District with treatment provided by upgrading an existing PNP Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP), or locating a new WWTP along French Creek, and; 3) A Town of French Creek (PNP) with treatment provided by upgrading the existing PNP WWTP, or locating a new WWTP along French Creek. Members of the sewer agency include county legislators Marty Proctor (chair) and Jay Gould; town supervisors Rebecca Brumagin (Mina), Mark Persons (Sherman), and Dave White (French Creek); Village of Sherman Mayor Colleen Meeder, and; At-Large Member Ed Mulkearn. 

Artist Ehren Knapp Created Findley Lake Murals & His Aviation Art is on Display at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force





Ehren Knapp (at left), an Eriebased freelance artist and art instructor, created three collages of Findley Lake scenes and painted them onto



the sides of two buildings. The three murals (see photos) are 8' x 68' (east wall of the fire hall), 6' x 28' and 6' x 22' (both on the west wall of Twin Docks). The murals bring the history and allure of Findley Lake to life and

they brighten up the downtown area. Although he specializes in murals, teaching, and artistic concept generation, Ehren is also a pilot and an aviation artist. He recently received the distinction of being selected as one of 40 international artists to display his work at the 33rd Annual International Aerospace Art Exhibition at the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force in Dayton, Ohio. Ehren's three-panel 4' tall and 5'5" wide oil painting "B-17" depicts the iconic World War II four-engine heavy bomber also known as the Flying Fortress that was designed by the Boeing Aircraft Company. Additionally, Ehren was recently notified that he was awarded the prestigious "ForeFeathers" Enterprises' Plaque du Beaque Award for the most creative approach to telling an aviation story or depicting an aviation event. In Ehren's biography he states, "What I admire I paint." Artwork for the aviation show was judged by the American Society of Aviation Artists. The exhibit opened on May 10, 2019 and runs through Oct. 31, 2019.

Ehren is an Erie native, U.S. Marine Corps veteran, studied at the Laguna College of Art and Design in California, the Studio Art Centers International in Florence, Italy and earned a BFA from Edinboro University. In regard to his mural creations, he credits his parents with allowing him to draw on the walls at home when he was growing up! The three artistic murals in Findley Lake were made possible through the generosity of 30 individual, family, and corporate donors.

System in Akron, OH and the University of Akron.

In Findley Lake, Vegas put on a show for the children including strumming his acoustic guitar (photo bottom left). A video is on YouTube of Vegas accompanying "Elvis" and hospital staff as they sing "Let's Wash" (to the tune of "Jailhouse Rock"). Mary and her husband, Rich, own a cottage at 2669 Sunnyside that was a boathouse when it was purchased by her parents, Jack & Elma Castor, in the early 1960's. In 1877, Mary's great great-grandfather, F.L. Bliss, was one of the founders of Ajax Iron Works in Corry and he patented a steam engine reversing mechanism.
